a) Geological Survey, Location of Block and Assessment of the Mineral in the Block.

The Indian shield rocks are exposed in area of Sindh and Punjab. In Punjab plains, the basement rocks are exposed near Sargodha. These rocks are basically igneous rocks and generally known as Karana Hills. The block in question is located near crush market of Chak No. 123/S.B. This block is comprises over an area of 56.91 acres out of which only 17.07 acres are available for excavation and remaining is already exhausted . In this block 03 khat & 04 to 05 pits are existing for stone excavation.
